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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, you may not know this question...the answer to this question, so I want to ask Senator Foley a question, because he may help me on this.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator, would you respond?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Foley, was there a place known as limbo in a religious context?

SENATOR FOLEY: I don't (laugh), Senator Chambers, I don't know if there ever was such a place. You're referring to Catholic theology.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Uh-huh.

SENATOR FOLEY: I don't, you know, I honestly don't know if the Catholic Church ever defined a place called limbo. I think that people talked about it, but I don't know if the Catholic Church ever defined that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But...but you're familiar with the term anyway.

SENATOR FOLEY: Oh, yes. Oh, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, I had to call on our resident father of the church because I was talking to a Catholic and all of the children who died before they were baptized or reached a certain age would be in limbo, and there's only one adult who will be in limbo, only one adult. That adult is Abraham Lincoln, because Abraham Lincoln was not a Christian. But Abraham Lincoln was considered such a good guy that all those little babies and Abraham Lincoln, pick the tallest guy in the world to put him running around with all those little babies, it's like Gulliver and the Lilliputians. But I just thought I'd throw that in because this bill is being pulled from limbo. How much time do you all want to spend on it? Well, Senator Janssen said that you can get your cloture vote this morning. This bill is not prioritized. I assure you all that I am going to redouble my efforts on Select File and since this is the first time this particular activity was done I
