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because of that, I feel like that a change in the way we value property, the way we pay taxes on agriculture and this land is past due. And I appreciate the fact you brought this bill. I know that you knew when you brought it forth, it would have some long hours of debate because there is some differences of opinion and that's good. That's what...that's what legislative chambers are for. But I have to tell you I'm going to continue to support this piece of legislation because I think it's the right thing. Obviously, if I didn't, I wouldn't support it, and that...that goes without saying. But I just wanted you to know that I'm going to support the A bill because I think the A bill, even though we're not exactly sure what it...what it is, it's an important part of any piece of legislation if you expect to get it into place. Obviously, I would hope, as I'm sure most of my colleagues would hope that the A bill isn't a monumental amount of money that would cause us more pain in the Appropriations Committee, and we can somehow put this thing into place. And if it's my understanding, this bill is not going to even take effect for a couple of years. So I'm sure it's Senator Coordsen's hope, and certainly I would guess everybody else's hope in this Chamber, that by that time our economy is stabilized and we're back to more normal times. That's the reason I'm going to support it. I am going to continue to support it. I know there is those who feel differently about it because...and they have their reasons, just as I have my reasons. So I guess I would ask that you vote against the indefinitely to postpone amendment that Senator Chambers has put...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...put up and that we move ahead with this piece of legislation and find out what the body really wants to do, and I guess that's the final analysis. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members of the body. I always hesitate to punch my button to get on the microphone because I have to first overcome my natural shyness, which is a considerable task, but I rise in support of the IPP
