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finance limitation. I do not believe...we have spent one and a half million dollars on Governors races in the past and I don't believe raising it to two and a half million or right at two and a half million, a dollar fifty per person counted on a constituent basis, I don't think that's inappropriate. That's not even a covered race. It doesn't even affect this. We should hope that we have that kind and type and quality of a campaign which two and a half million can produce. I'm not saying it always does, but we should hope we would have...we could have that kind of campaign of the quality that could come from the spending of that kind of money, and that we would have two candidates and two parties advancing their cause, their ideas, and their issues to that extent. The other statewide races, it would be raised from \$150,000, which I will tell you, in my opinion, you cannot effectively be done in a competitive environment. Now, if we want to foster incumbency and if we want to foster a noncompetitive environment, keep it low so it just can't be done. I don't think \$840,000 for a statewide race is inappropriate and that...that translates, I know some don't agree with the methodology, but just in terms of logic that translates to \$.50 per person. For the Legislature, we allow ourselves \$73,000, and that is \$2.20 per person for the Legislature. So if that gives you any kind of measure, I'm trying to show you how illogical and maybe unrelated these sums are, but it would be raised from \$73,000 to \$105,000 under the amendment, and the Board of Regents, Board of Education, Public Service Commission and the like would go from \$50,000 to \$425,000, and that's from \$2.00 per person...from \$.25 per person to \$2.00 per person. I think this is an opportunity for us to express how we feel about this and I would...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...urge the adoption of the amendment and, Madam President, I'd request a roll call vote, please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. We are still waiting on Senator Robak. Senator Robak, would you please report to the Chamber. The house is under call. Mr. Clerk, would you please call the roll. Senator Brashear requested a roll call vote.
