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SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, when you look at this bill you'll see that there are a large number of amendments filed to it. Everybody makes judgments about the amendments and some of those amendments, of course, are more important than others. What the substituted amendment would do would be to try to take out the most important amendments and put them into one amendment so that we could deal with them up front and now. And so the Game and Parks fee, Senator Dierks' rewrite to protect property owners from Game and Parks officers walking on their land, and the eighth commissioner, those three things are all in the proposed amendment that I would substitute so that we can deal with them all at once and then either move forward with the bill or not move forward with the bill. So that's what I'm proposing to you and I believe it's supported by the Chair and I would give the remainder of my time to Senator Schrock.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator who, Senator Beutler? Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Yes, I do think this is a good proposal. It will, hopefully, expedite the issue and we can move forward. I think it's a substantial bill, has a lot of...lot of ramifications for agriculture as far as the chronic wasting disease, and I think it's a good bill. It has some clarifying language for Game and Parks on a lot of hunting issues. I did neglect to say that it allows more buddy hunting and some things like that in the bill. I think Senator Baker has some provision in there and so it's a rather comprehensive bill. A lot of this was discussed on General File. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock, Senator Beutler. Senator Smith, on the motion to substitute.
