in the bill. I don't believe I can get them stripped, but I can certainly talk about them until you all decide to vote cloture. Then, after we get through with LB 1003 we got LB 1168. We don't need a task force to study fatigue as it relates to railroad employees or, if we need it, then the body will vote cloture. Then, when we get to the agenda tomorrow, which will be Wednesday and I don't know what's coming up, if we're on Select File or General File I need to begin to show that I mean what I said. But will I take every bill? That would be too predictable. When will I start and how far will I go? That's for me to decide because, as that program called "Outer Limits" says, for the next hour we have control of your television set; don't try to change the horizontal, don't try to change the vertical, don't try to change the clear or whatever it is; you just sit back and be cool because you have been delivered into my hands. SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...am resentful of the way Game and Parks has done things down through the years, and if they are able to derail this session, I don't care. I will just have to make you all mad at me for twenty-two days. Then, by the time we start again in January, you all will have forgotten and you'll forgive me. You might even forgive me before the session is over. Who knows? I can maintain my mood, whatever it is, but you all cannot. So even if you get angry today, you'll eat a good meal this evening, you'll get a good night's rest, you'll come back tomorrow refreshed, ready to go, and you won't feel as mean toward me as you might feel this evening. But we will just see how this develops. I'm going to put Senator Beutler in a position to work his magic without us having to take a vote on whether or not he'll be allowed to substitute. I withdraw my objection to his motion to substitute.
