SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you, Mr. President and members. What I'm going to say, I'm going to be very brief, not going to say a whole lot, but I would say that I am, like Senator Smith, I am concerned about the fee increases and I really don't know if now is the time. But I would like to say one thing on the record, and if we do allow a fee increase there's areas that bother me. We've got to remember that agriculture is our number one industry in Nebraska and I don't feel that the Game and Parks Commission is real responsive to farmers when it comes to dealing with some issues, and I would mention prairie dogs. And, with that, after having it on the record, I think I'll sit down.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Senator Janssen, on part three of the divided question to the committee amendments to LB 1003.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator, Senator Cudaback, members. Senator Chambers, you know, I hadn't figured on speaking on this amendment and I...but you got be riled up, thank you very much, and I want to talk a little bit about the silver chalice that I have here. I have a silver chalice and I have a gold chalice and they were given to me by one of my grandsons, Elliott, for Christmas, so I told him that, yes, I would take the silver chalice down to the Legislature and sip my brew, coffee, out of that. That is where the silver chalice came from, if you're interested. And I believe you've met my grandson Elliott from one time or the other. We're talking now, the way I understand the division of this question is, going from \$14 per permit that will go on a vehicle to \$18. People who probably oppose any kind of an increase in our state park permits, to get into them, would...and I'm not...I'm not picking on any one individual, but some of those people would be the first ones to complain if the weeds weren't mowed around the camping areas, if there was not enough outdoor grills for them to grill their hot dogs or their...or their hamburgers, and they would also probably be the first ones to complain if the trash wasn't picked up around the areas. So a modest \$4 increase, Senator Chambers, I think after you got my mainspring wound up, I think I will support it. It is a modest increase. It's not what the Game and Parks were
