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in all three cases they had my total credit card number on the receipt. So I don't think everybody's doing it, and what we're trying to do is give you enough time.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: But if, in my case, if that...if my registers were not able to do this, you know, five years really is not enough time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, I would certainly be willing to talk with you about that, Senator Cunningham, and talk with the retailers, and the grocers. But it was my understanding that they thought that this was going to be adequate time.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Well, and...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And...and we did work on the language of the bill with them. But I'd certainly be receptive to hearing any suggestions and...and maybe we could talk about that between now and...

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...Select File.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Well, the part...the part that bothered me is when you said that you got three receipts and they all printed the whole number, which tells me my registers may very well do the same thing, and so I am concerned about that. But I will do some more checking on that issue.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And...and if I might, just one little last thing. This bill is based on one in Washington State. California also has passed it, and I think that it's going to happen, sooner or later, probably, everywhere. We're just maybe a little ahead of the curve.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Okay. Thank you.
