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SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Seeing no further lights, Senator Schimek, would you like to close on your amendment? Senator Schimek waives closing. We're now voting on the amendment, AM3077. All those in favor signify by voting aye; those nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, on adoption of Senator Schimek's amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. (Visitors introduced.) Further discussion on the bill? Seeing no one else, Senator Redfield, to close on the bill.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Senator Janssen, thank you. There are members of the Education Committee off the floor, they asked that I request a call of the house so that they could return to vote for the bill. So I would request that at this time.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor signify by aye, those nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The house is under call. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor and senators check in. Senator Redfield, would you like to go on ahead with your closing? Senator Redfield, would you like to start your closing?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Yes, thank you, Senator Janssen. I just want to thank everyone for their comments. I believe this is a very important bill, certainly from the calls that come into our office. We know that there are many, many people in Nebraska who are going to thank you for your vote today. And I would
