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officials have the tools that they need to manage that outbreak. I guess we're...we're just not quite there in terms of what is appropriate in what we would now characterize as Section 5 of the bill. I think we'll get there. We just aren't there at the moment. We will get there by Select File and hopefully be able to resolve the situation. But in the meantime, if we can take that section out so that we can come back completely clean on Select File, I think that's appropriate. I'm glad that Senator Schrock agrees with me and I'm sure we will be able to do it. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the Wickersham amendment. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Wickersham's amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further pending to the committee amendments at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Back to debating the adoption of the committee amendments. Senator Schrock, you're recognized to close on those committee amendments.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, we're back to a pretty basic bill here now, without fees. It allows the commission to acknowledge a stamp has been purchased without requiring a physical stamp or a facsimile thereof on a hunting and fishing stamp. It allows the Game and Parks Commission to sell permits from its web site and collect a dollar for clerical work. It changes the current buddy hunting application to allow for five individuals to apply for a permit together instead of the current two, I believe that is the way. It allows the limit of hunting permits for deer, antelope, wild turkey and elk to be given to persons who are qualifying landowners or leaseholders and their immediate families which is defined as husband, wife or children, and this is because we have people saying they've
