leased land out when they haven't, maybe an uncle or something, and they are getting their landowner permit under false pretenses. Other issues in here are on turkeys, and antelope and elk. We have Senator Don Pederson's bill in this bill that...that identifying red paint marks on fence posts. Farmers can do that, landowners can do that, and that will mean no hunting. It will be a universal...it will be a universal sign that people will be aware of. It has to be at least every 100 yards for a mark. And it has some Niobrara Council issues in here that Senator...Senator Beutler brought to us. So we're...it has a paddlefish permit, a few other things like that that we covered in our opening remarks on this amendment. So there's quite a few things in here that I think support the Game and Parks, and I would ask for your vote to advance this bill.
