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going to because God knows it hasn't done you much good when it comes to legislation that's for those who really need our help. So, since I'm going to take my time today, I may as well discuss some of the things that pertain to the structure of the Legislature and how we function, and to serve notice that I am tired of these long-winded prayers. So who are they praying to? Are they trying to inform God? Is it a fact that God really doesn't know? God is asleep and you've got to keep nudging him and poking him to wake him up? They all say the same thing, basically, when they pray. And then, like I say, the camera pans, there ain't nobody in here. B.B. King sang a song, "Ain't Nobody Home": No you can't come back here; ain't nobody home. And that's the way it is in this Chamber. And religion is supposed to mean something to you all. And you besmirch it, you trivialize it, and you make it a joke in that fashion and you expect me to take it more seriously than you do? If something was of great meaning and worth to me, I would not handle it in such a cavalier, casual manner. I would not cast my pearls before swine. That's what your Jesus said. So what are you doing when you get these guys down here and give them the impression that they can conduct a mini revival and save some of these reprobates on the floor of the Legislature? That must be what their intention is. If they're going to do the right thing they ought to restrict what they say to about 15 seconds, if they've got to say something, and say, Lord, it takes me about 15 seconds to tell you that I'm glad to be alive, glad to be here, and glad to get out of here, and get to stepping. That's what they ought to do. I was invited to a huge church in New York. I mean it took up blocks, literally. Big shots go there, Presidents, and they had me to say a few words, believe it or not. And I went down this aisle, and there were people in front of me wearing gowns and ribbons and hats and robes and all kind of strange attire. And there were dignitaries flanking me...
