help others or this or that, if too many make that pledge we have that violation of our conscience right there. I don't know how you can make laws in a body of 49 or 150 or whatever it is without having a moving...a moving target, if you will, and having to make some decisions that are difficult to make. Whether you call that situational ethics I'm not sure. I suppose some would. But seems to me we're having to do some things that normally you wouldn't do and I'm making cuts in education that I normally wouldn't want to do. I'm making cuts in higher education that I normally wouldn't want to do. I'm making some cuts in Medicaid that I ordinarily wouldn't want to do, but those times are here. And the implication if we do what Senator Chambers wants to do, not only in the word "only" which is the issue right in front of us, but the issue of \$6 million, implies to many of us that we're going to have to find that money somewhere else. I don't know whether that implies to him or not. I'm not going to...I'm not going to read into what he's trying to say. But any cut...any changes that we make in this point implies a ripple effect. I'll use the balloon example that we all use. You put some pressure here and the balloon is going to be somewhere else. So anything that we do to change you're free to do. I'm not...that's not a threat. But it also implies that there will be some cut somewhere else or there will be a revenue increase to compensate, and if that's part of the...of this, the vote in this issue, so be it. That's fine. This is a way. This is a way that was suggested, in our case, from the appropri...from the Governor and ultimately through the Appropriations Committee as we wade through many of these issues. So I guess that's your decision, but if \$6 million or \$2 million or all the other millions, there's \$20 million in this transfer bill in LB 1310 and if that's the way we want to do it, not take these transfers, then that's just \$20 million more that's going to have to be done somewhere else or \$20 million more in cuts. And, frankly, I haven't had anyone come to me and tell me where they can make some more cuts. I know there's a couple of amendments coming up, one that's going to be a very severe cut to the University of Nebraska, and I guess I will warn I know where to...
