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those bills made the change. Statutorily, our committee can't make a lot of these changes because the statute has to be changed. This particular year, there really wasn't time to react to all that. From my viewpoint, next year, if things continue as they are and don't improve much, we are going to have to do some statutory changes to make some cuts. And I'll invite anybody that wants to make...to introduce those bills in the areas of the services that you want to cut to do that. One other thing, and jumping back, I know I am jumping about, back and forth a little bit, but the University of Nebraska's budget, I'll tell you where the cuts are going to be, as I see it and understand it. If we take additional cuts, it's going to go to extension and research. It's going to hurt the very areas of Nebraska that desperately need continued help with Management for Tomorrow, the Main Street Program, all of those agriculture related areas; the areas of value-added development. Who is going to do that if it isn't the university engine? That's what's going to be cut if we continue to cut the university's budget, and it's certainly been implied to me that that's what will happen. So I think additional cuts, in my mind, in this area are going to hurt the very people that probably need the help as much as any to try to find additional areas in rural Nebraska that can help themselves and move forward, find broader uses for products, establish broader areas for value-added production of some...whatever, using basic products, or getting businesses relocated in rural Nebraska. The other areas, then, that you look, get off of higher education, and then you go to the areas...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...that have increased; state aid to individuals and state aid to local governments. That's where...they're 6.6 up, in the middle part, state aid to individuals, and 4.7 up for state aid to local governments, which, I admit, some of those took, some of there took pretty good...pretty good cuts except for the state aid to education. But the point is, if we really want to cut services, which I...I think we have this balance all the time to decide, just like we do on highways, is it the gas tax? Do you want good roads? I mean we all hear this. I think it's almost a 50-50 balance,
