SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Quandahl. Senator Tyson on the Revenue Committee amendments.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members of the body. While it doesn't have any effect on me, I will just tell you that I've noticed what many of you may have also noticed, and that is, I've noticed this for the last several years, a good number of people of my acquaintance have changed their domicile to other states because of the Nebraska taxation schedules. One comes to mind who is enjoying the sunny South now because he has a home in Texas, but he is also now a citizen of Texas. Several have gone to South Dakota. Again, it's entirely tax structure, and this strikes to the heart of this. This is, in the words of Charles Dickens, vengeance pursued beyond the grave. Right? For that reason and for that reason only, I'm going to vote against this, and I'm going to urge you to vote against it. I have been spoken to, pressured, et cetera, by county commissioners in my district to support this because the money accruing to the county is...is more or less found money, and they can use it for a variety of things for which their normal revenue sources don't...don't cover. I was told of an instance out in Keya Paha County where they used estate tax to buy grader blades because they didn't have the money to buy grader blades, and they cost \$400 apiece. So some of the county commissioners across the state are...I'm sure are very much in support of this. I am not. I urge you to be not. I urge you to vote against it. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Senator Wickersham, there are no further lights on. You're recognized to close on the Revenue Committee amendments to LB 905 if you care to.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Mr. President, and I'm...I only wish to respond to two things that Senator Tyson raised. As long as you're alive, this doesn't affect you at all. And I think those persons moved to Texas and South Dakota because they don't have an income tax. We might get to talk about that later. I don't know.
