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of these into the personal pockets of the Lincoln County Attorneys. Is that accurate?

SENATOR CONNEALY: From...from the information we have, that's what it looks like. I can't respond fully because we don't have any oversight. We have no way to know how each one of those claims were set up or whether they were all even or not, but it looks to me like the court says, well, if you have administrative license revocation under my jurisdiction then you'll get \$500.

SENATOR BEUTLER: What happens, Senator, if we don't pay these claims? What are the consequences?

SENATOR CONNEALY: I'm not sure but I think it's a bill that we owe and I think that if a court orders the state to pay then we should pay. I think that the underlying management process and for here on out we ought to do it a different way. We ought to...we ought to control and manage and have more information, but under the system that's set up right now, because it's been turned over to other attorneys, then I think that we need to pay them.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Let me go back and...and ask you, these are all being paid pursuant to the court case called what now?

SENATOR CONNEALY: Winter v. the Department of Motor Vehicles.

SENATOR BEUTLER: That was decided when?

SENATOR CONNEALY: It was 1999 I think.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Nineteen ninety-nine?

SENATOR CONNEALY: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Then when that case was decided that indicated basically that the county attorneys, under our...under our present statute, the state is required to pay the county
