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SENATOR CHAMBERS: And have all the people who need to be involved said that they will agree with that and there's a guarantee that...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...15...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No, not that I'm aware of. I can only speak for myself, Senator Chambers, and the only reason I'm taking that position is because 28 people voted for it, and if they tell me in that instance I'm willing to accede to their wishes in that respect if we can get some of it back to the General Fund which is, in my opinion, where it all should have gone if we were going to have an increase anyway.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if it does not go to the General Fund, the amount of it that you're interested in,...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Then I won't...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...where do you stand then?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...then I won't support it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But it will be too late. You will have put it in a position to have done its damage. Wouldn't you have helped do that?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: If the...if...if we do...if the amendment to...to divert 15 cents to the General Fund is not successful then I'll oppose the amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if they, in their obdurateness, add it anyway, even though you don't like it, your bill then carries something that you disagree with. Would that be true?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That would be correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I won't pursue it any further, but I
