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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Fire away, my son.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. Well, you have talked at length about your opposition to the proposal that Senator Wickersham brought forth.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You mean Senator Jensen's? That's what we're on now.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. I do have another comment too. I think that person that you named about the lever to move the world, I think the person really was Senator Chambers who is in charge of that. But that's another issue we won't talk about.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Senator, you've indicated your opposition, and I have been listening to the debate and discussion, as all of us have, I want you to tell us in your own mighty mind, what you did...what you would say was the...was the answer to the problem that we're...that we're faced with?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Income tax increase.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Only?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, that will...we don't need anything else if we do that and do it properly.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Do you think that the income tax increase will cover \$400 million in the outset...outgoing years?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If we do this properly we won't have the problem that we have now. And you're...if you're representing rural constituents, you don't even have to worry because they're not going to pay a lot of income tax.

SENATOR VRTISKA: You don't know how much income tax I pay, do you? Or do you know that too?
