It is never going to be a problem with them, and their main difficulty is to be sure they don't overspend on things that are harmful. So when you have a society where there's a huge gap between those who have and those who have not, the "haves" are going to dictate everything that happens to everybody. If the "haves", themselves, are not on this floor, they have their surrogates and others who will make sure that their interests are taken care of. Senator Brashear demonstrated that the other day. The big business big shots have been taken care of and protected. Now here comes Senator Jensen showing that the body, which is willing to exempt the big shots, are willing to stick it to those least able to take care of themselves. They're addicted already. They're at a disadvantage. They have no voice on this floor that carries enough weight to see that they get treated fairly. So those of us who are...
