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tax, but it's all put on the personal property tax schedule and pay a personal property tax on that...that each year, and it just gets to the place where enough is enough, and I don't know whether I can vote on this to pass it on to Select File. I understand we're trying to do it; at that time, then we can try to address some of these situations as they come up, but I just think that we've had plenty of taxes on the production side of agriculture. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kremer. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President and members of the body, I want to stand up and talk just a little bit about this amendment in front of us tonight because it kind of changes the picture on a lot of things and there's some things on here that I...I do not like. But I think Senator Kremer hit the nail on the head on a lot of the issues that...on agriculture that we cannot pass it on. And I know that a lot of people are concerned about that but I don't know just how to handle that. I know I talked to Senator Wickersham earlier about it on the repairs on labor and that's something that I've got some concerns with yet, but I do like the part on the income tax and I think that that's going to go over a little bit better in my district than adding the sales tax, because we all got to buy repairs out there. Whether we're making a dollar or not, we still got to buy them repairs. And what I'd say here tonight, that proceduralwise that I think we're going to have to move this on to Select File and see what we can adjust or change then. Something else that I think that we're going to have to do, I think we're going to have to look at LB 1309 and see if we can't get some more cuts there. It'd been nice if we could a got enough cuts there to start out with so the Revenue Committee wouldn't had such a big burden, but I guess I still need to compliment the Appropriations for the work they did on it, but it did put a burden on the Revenue Committee to come up with all this income side of it. Because I think the people in my district, they want the cuts rather than new tax. But, anyway, that's where I'm coming at tonight; that I think I'll move it on. I'd like to ask Senator Kristensen a question, if I could.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Kristensen, will you yield to a
