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called me and said I said a \$5 million, and we're talking about \$500,000. Again, this doesn't move the dollars. This is just asking the Department of Corrections...or telling the Department of Corrections that we want them to cut in this area rather than in their programming to inmates. I think it's appalling that we use \$270,000 to administer \$275,000 in grants. Figure that up, people. That's about half the money they're giving is using for administration. This just says that program goes down and we can put it into programming for the inmates. Last year, it's no secret that I've never been in support of this program, I'll be honest with you, straightforward, but last year I decided I was not going to touch this program again until after I read this letter from Director Clarke that they were going to cut programs for the inmates, educational programs, things that help inmates stay off the street, to put them to work and stay out of prison. When there's a program like this that does not help immediate inmates, that's where I'm asking you to support me in cutting it. Again, \$270,000 to administer \$275,000, when the Crime Commission turns around and uses \$157,000 to administer \$10 million to \$12 million. And this would give us over \$500,000 to put back into educational programs to help us in our public safety in keeping some of these people out of prison. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Pedersen. There are no further lights. Would you wish to close?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: I think what I just said was a good enough closing. I'm hoping the support is here, and if not, I will have no problem with what this body has to say, never have. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Pedersen. The question is then the adoption of the Pedersen amendment, AM3313. All in favor say...vote aye; all opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Yes, Senator Pedersen.
