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January 1st of the year in which the Governor is elected, we said January 1st of the previous year so that it coincided with the two-year campaign period that's defined in the accountability statutes?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, we talked about that, Senator Beutler, and considered doing that. One of the things I really didn't want to do with this amendment was to prevent, you know, legitimate kinds of public service announcements, et cetera. And as we started talking about the kinds of things that were promotional materials and so forth, one of the things that popped into mind was the maps of the state of Nebraska that have the Governor's picture and name and so forth on it. Well, that...that could be considered, I suppose, a promotional material...promotional material for tourism for the state, et cetera, and I didn't want to make the time frame so large that, you know, you'd have to actually order maps three years in advance of when you wanted to distribute them. I can imagine that we're still going to have to have state road maps. They will still have the Governor's picture on them but you can't...you can't buy them in the year of the election. You could still give them out then, obviously. Do you see what I'm getting at? I didn't want to make it such a huge time frame that was too restrictive, but I'm open to arguments on that and discussion.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Well, just questions I thought I would probe a little bit. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Seeing no further lights on for discussion of LB 1086, Senator Chambers, wish to close on advancement of LB 1086?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No close. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers waives that opportunity to close. The question before the body is advancement of LB 1086 to E & R Initial. All in favor of that advancement vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the advancement of LB 1086. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.
