regulated, and the whole purpose being that we don't want to make respite care service, as we introduced it in LB 148, to be punitive. We want it to encourage as many people on a person-to-person basis to provide services. The department is, naturally, afraid that somebody will decide to go into the business of respite care and will not have any kind of licensure. So we've tried to make allowances for both so we don't chill in any way those individuals, next-door neighbors, people working part time down the street that want to provide respite care, and also to protect anybody that might be vulnerable in this situation. So I would ask your adoption of AM3312 to LB...to the committee amendments.
