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SENATOR JENSEN: At the...at the end of the sentence on 18 maybe. Or any combination thereof used by the public or for public use, would that be any different?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. That would...

SENATOR JENSEN: On line 18.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...that would work probably. This is the last amendment on this bill?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Let me ask you one other question while we're on the entire topic here. On top of page 2,...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time. You may continue, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: On the top of page 2, we've exempted apparently from the definition of swimming pool, and therefore from, I assume, the regulation of DHH, pools that are operated exclusively for medical treatment, physical therapy, water rescue training, or training of divers.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Why have we excluded those?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, certainly medical...

SENATOR BEUTLER: I mean Bryan Hospital, for example, has a big pool that people come and it's used, I think, exclusively for therapy and medical treatment, but why aren't they included?

SENATOR JENSEN: I would think because that they would fall underneath the hospital regulations, but I'm not sure. There is no question about it. We have therapeutic pools today that we didn't used to have. And yes, the medical...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, is the last bill of the session that this can go on?
