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with another census that this could go...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...completely the other way. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I guess as I was listening to Senator Erdman, I think his experiences are probably limited...more limited than mine. I guess before I got this high-paying job I served awhile as a school board member. And what I see as...and I think that it is true with the Game and Parks like the superintendent of schools, I think most of the time in the Game and Parks they're going to follow the leadership of the director. The director is going to be the person that leads, whether they live in my county, live in Senator Wehrbein's county, Cass County, live in Senator Vrtiska's county. I don't think it makes any difference. I think they're going to depend...I think the people that are appointed by the Governor to this...to this commission are going to do what is best for Nebraska, what is best for the Games and Parks of the state. And they're going to follow the leadership of the director. And so I think whether the number is eight...I guess I support that because I may...we may in Sarpy County may have a chance for to get a commissioner sometime because I guess according to Senator Beutler they're all...for the...for the long history they've come from Lancaster County. And I think they're going to follow the leadership of the director. And I think that that's the more important thing with that, that there is a good director that looks out for the welfare of the Games and Parks in this state. And so I think it's a good, reasonable move. And like Senator Wehrbein said, you know, maybe in ten years they're not...might not very many, there are all of us that will be in...have more...we have about five senators now, we've moved up from three in Sarpy County, so maybe we'll have...we'll have more. So I think it's reasonable that we move ahead with Senator Beutler's amendment and reject Senator Erdman's amendment. Thank you.
