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says that other members of the Natural Resources Committee of the Legislature may participate as desired, would you have any objection to saying that any member of the Legislature may participate as desired?

SENATOR SCHROCK: No objection at all. If you want to make that change, I would be agreeable to that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. If you're agreeable to that, I'm going to make that change.

SENATOR SCHROCK: If I may just have a minute?

SENATOR BEUTLER: And honestly I'd like to sit in on some of those meetings.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yeah. If I may have a minute?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR SCHROCK: The original task force we proposed had 70-some members on it. And the reason I wanted to do that is because I want to be very inclusive in this. I don't want to be exclusive, and so there was no intent on my part to exclude any member of the Legislature from sitting in on these issues. And so, Senator Beutler, this is a good idea. We had trouble getting this down to 49 members, and in my brief legislative career, I have never had more people call me up and say, Senator Schrock, I want to be on that task force. Well, the Governor has the task of appointing those people and, believe you me, I think those of you in the body can have influence. If you have a constituent that would like to serve on the task force, I think you should come forward to the Governor. I think Roger Patterson will have a lot of influence with the Governor on who is appointed to this task force. It's a rather large number of people to be appointed in a short period of time. I can tell you that Roger Patterson has some people in mind who should be facilitator and coordinator, and for obvious pur... reasons he hasn't shared that with me and I don't want to know. That can happen after the bill takes shape. So thank you, Senator Beutler, for that...for that suggested change. Very agreeable
