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feel strongly...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: ...or believe something in a majority, that we should automatically give it to a vote of the people, possibly? Is that what you're trying to lead us to believe?

SENATOR JENSEN: No. This was a poll, and...and if you'd read on down through there, it would tell you how they view the increase of a 50-cent tax increase, and would they support different candidates if they supported a 50-cent tax increase.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Would you feel comfortable in putting it to a vote of the people of the state of Nebraska, like Washington did?

SENATOR JENSEN: We have an initiative process here in Nebraska. And anyone that wants to partake in that certainly is free to do so.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: I..would you re...would you introduce something along them lines?

SENATOR JENSEN: I believe, certainly, in the representative process here. But, certainly we've had initiatives that have come forward several times. Some of them I've supported, some I have not. But that is, I think, the second house in the state of Nebraska.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Senator Connealy mentioned the Governor's...this isn't the Governor's plan, is that correct?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Thank you, Senator Jensen.
