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Fund. It increases to 41 cents after 7/1 of 2016. That's when the 309 Building Fund goes away. This...and seven cents goes...excuse me, seven cents goes to the Building Renewal, including a...reduces back to five cents after 2016. And the other funds stay the same. I know we've been struggling over cigarette taxes for quite some time. The argument is always the same and I understand everyone's feelings about what we should do with these taxes and the ultimate goal is to eventually convince the general public that tobacco is not the right thing to be using. And I understand all the health problems it causes. But right now we are seeing a decline in smoking. I think people are finally wising up, but those people who are still addicted, in my opinion, are going to buy cigarettes and other tobacco-related items. If the price is too high in this state, believe me, a hard-core tobacco user is going to find another source of that product that he has become addicted to. That means the surrounding states around us, which no one is really too remote that...anymore that they can't get there. And the others is my good friends, the tribes, have the cigarettes also they are manufacturing on their land. I think that this...the 20 cents was what the Revenue Committee had in their plan. I wanted 10 cents, but I compromised with Senator Landis and a few others and to let that...the Revenue package come out at a 20-cent increase in the cigarettes and other tobacco products. That...to me, this, I think is the logical way to go. It's not going to drive people who are addicted out of the state at \$2 a carton. I think that's...I think that's a compromise and I know Senator Jensen is going to argue different, but I think that we've got something here that most of us can live with and we have some other things down the road but I think this is, in my opinion, is a good start to a compromise on the tobacco products. With that, I would answer any questions that anyone would have and I ask for your support in the...in this compromise. It's not a drastic increase, not to me it isn't, but I'm sure to the ones that use the tobacco products it is. But I think we can live with this. Anything over this I cannot vote for or support and reluctantly will oppose it and fight it on the floor. But this I think we can all live with. Thank you.
