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SENATOR WICKERSHAM: It'll go out by...for this year, it will have to be delayed a little bit, but I think the...otherwise, it's intended to go out by February 15.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. All right. Thank you.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: This year it'll go out by May 15,...

SENATOR BROMM: Yeah.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...we hope.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you. I think that that's...this is, as Senator Wickersham said, a re...a recapitulation or an explanation of what was already intended, but I think it's essential that we get this right because I think changing the state aid to schools at this particular point in time could be extremely difficult to assimilate into the school budgets, and it may be anyway, but this will provide them an opportunity to, if their board chooses by a three-fourths vote, to utilize their budget levy tax-levying authority to cushion the blow a little bit. And again, we're talking property tax, which we don't like to do, but we're doing a lot of things I think this year that we don't normally do and that we don't like to do because of the situation that we're in. So I appreciate the hard work that has gone into, trying to make sure that we're getting the details...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...right and I think this is apparently one of those details that we need to do. So I certainly support the amendment and appreciate the work that's been done on it. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Wickersham, this will be your third time.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, Mr. President, I'm...I think that we have had a fairly good discussion of what the amendment does, and then we're still attempting to get the amendment to the amendment ready. And if I might just discuss what the amendment
