SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The...this is based on the budget that we sent over. It does not presume and was not prepared with any of the cuts, the additional cuts. What's unusual is the Governor's vetoes are in addition to what we sent over.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: So that would...if you would not override, it would add more dollars to the bottom.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. So if we override none of his, it's roughly 63,...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Plus...

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...well, 64 million from his sheet.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Right, whatever his sheet is,...

SENATOR THOMPSON: That's on LB 1309.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Right.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You take...you take those, and those would be positive numbers towards the bottom.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. And I guess there is some from the current fiscal year of 8.2, so that...I'm just...I'm just reading one line. Okay, I think I have the picture then. I guess just...just to weigh in on this...on this debate a little bit, I looked at the Governor's veto list and this is going to kind of come as a surprise to a lot of you, but there are things on that list that...that I can live with; not all of them. I think we need to spend some time. I think the Appropriations Committee needs to look at the impact. But if we don't, if we don't override those vetoes, if we take a...
