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SENATOR BROMM: ..to the future...

SENATOR BEUTLER: It's the possibility of the legislature changing that levy requirement that is...

SENATOR BROMM: Exactly.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...is problematic?

SENATOR BROMM: I think it's very problematic. I...

SENATOR BEUTLER: In order for the city to get outside of the levy, don't they have to have a vote of the people?

SENATOR BROMM: Not for bonds.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Don't they?

SENATOR BROMM: Not...not to make payments on their general revenue bonds.

SENATOR BEUTLER: To enter into bonded indebtedness in the first instance though don't they have to have a vote of the people?

SENATOR BROMM: If...if they're...if they're not...if they're revenue bonds I don't think they do.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, if they're revenue bonds, but if they're general obligation bonds they do, right?

SENATOR BROMM: I think they do, yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So a difference here is that in the one case there's a vote of the people to avoid the levy and in this case there's no vote of the people so you would be treating them differently if you...

SENATOR BROMM: Well, how are you going to get a vote of 80 subdivisions for this project?

SENATOR DW. PEDERSEN: Time.
