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have sales tax, hopefully starting July 1 to give us another cushion. It's our committee's conviction that this is not for spending, either the \$33 million or the \$8 million. It's not there to allow additional spending, but to allow a cushion for whatever revenue losses we have in the next few months. Going back to the vetoes or the overrides, however you want to look at it, going down most of those, it's our committee that...admittedly, some would like to make additional cuts. But as you look down those four pages, there are significant cuts not to my surprise, at least. Supreme Court eliminates the entire dispute resolution funding. If that goes, it's going to increase our court load tremendously. This is a very, very cost effective issue, for example. Drop to state aid NRDs, municipalities and counties; 25 percent cut, read that property tax increase in most cases. Section 13 looks like a lot of things. That is one program. You either take all of that or you take none. Those are all in one program, and even though there are several million dollars there, you can't touch it unless you do the whole cut or whole restoration, however you want to look at it. The Value-Added grants, I'll show you in the Agriculture. The first one is, in my biased opinion, LB 1348, one of our very successful value-added grant programs. This totally erases that if...if the cut was taken. Reduces money for animal damage, admittedly, a small amount, but very important to many counties; read that property tax. Market news service is very critical to some of us. Noxious weed program is very critical. Entomology program is very critical. Ag statistics program that many of you as well as farmers and ranchers depend on for accurate numbers. Turn over to page, the next page, I'm just looking at significant numbers, but, in fact, again, the Medicaid is a whole package in itself. All or none. Delay Developmental Disability rate equity, I know some of you, this fight has occurred before you came, but this has been an ongoing issue for 15 to 20 years where we have attempted to keep up paying the people that provide the services to development disability patients.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And we've worked hard at keeping...one minute, did you say? We've worked hard...we've worked hard to
