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And what those libraries can do for their students, and their citizens. So, we have not kept up anywhere near what we should, on a per capita basis, by the way, funding over the years. We've added some, not nearly enough. And remember, in the information technology age, many small towns' only access to this, for the ordinary public or the average public, is their library system. And they can go in and use that, reading the newspaper, reading the Internet, all those things, they have access there. A reimburse... jail reimbursement to 75 percent of original has to do with reimbursement for county jails. It's for prisoners that they keep for state prisoners. And we felt it important to keep... this would be, obviously, a very... a property tax issue. But as a growing concern for counties, it's an area we left in. The rest of it, the state colleges and universities, we kept them at their one percent cut, we restored it back to the one percent cut that we had done (inaudible) override. The Conservation Center in Omaha, Ford Conservation Center, I discussed that yesterday, but it's a nationwide reputation of restoration, I always don't have all the right words at what they do there, but it's... it was a relatively small amount, but it represents the staff, they're primarily cash funded except for the staffing. Without it this would close, and the valuable services that they render for restoration of artifacts, that may not be the right term, would be gone. Main street program covers statewide too. Many small towns across the state are using the Lied (inaudible). Lied, l-e-i-d (sic), Foundation matches this money. This is the match money. This is, if I recall right, the total match money in this particular program. And there are many towns ongoing across, and I would guess, pretty close to every district in this state, every district we represent, would have somebody on the (inaudible), self-help... self-help, a bootstrap program for businesses to... and small towns, to look at themselves with some professional help, professional consultation, if you will, to do that. The base staffing level is, slips me right this minute, it has to do with some commitments we've made within DED. I'll get a little more information on that, if you're interested in it. The economic development, \$40,000 is Lewis and Clark, a milestone in Nebraska, it's going to attract a wide variety of tourists over the next four to five years. And we felt this was half of that program. And so, we felt it important to keep our
