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okay, but keep in mind that it's not going to save money. We still need to house these folks someplace. And, again, it's a transfer rather than a cut. Now if someone figures out a way to decrease crime or drug abuse, I'll be the first in line to close some facilities. But until then and until Tecumseh gets their act together down there a little better, I think we need to keep what we have going that has proven to be successful. I think a vote to eliminate funding for the Hastings Correctional Center would trash a program that has proven to work very well as far as helping inmates flow back into society. And then there is those of us who think that we should really focus seriously on...on the state agencies being considered for rural Nebraska. Well, here we are, here we go. It's there already, good facility, good program, and we're talking about moving it east to the metropolitan area. So I think by cutting the funding for this, the problem won't go away. It's going to stay around and I think that it's a good example of the correctional system shooting itself in the foot to close a program like this and try to put them someplace else where they won't receive the same amount of care and concern and support and education and so forth. So I urge you to support my motion to restore funding to the Hastings Correctional Center, MO282. Thank you very much.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Burling. You've heard the closing on MO282 offered by Senator Burling to override. The question before the body is passage of that motion. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Burling.
