administrator doesn't require them to go to those meetings. Do they require them to go?

SENATOR ERDMAN: They have, as we have understood through discussion with their office, they do have their own, what they would call training or opportunities that they provide to do that. What my concern is realistically is that you have people, you have seven or nine county assessors who are employed by the state who aren't attending what I would consider reinforcement of the policy by attending it with the other county assessors. They're only reliant on what they hear from the administrator.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, how...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, could I ask Senator Erdman a question?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator, would you respond?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Senator Erdman, was this a bill...I don't remember this bill in...

SENATOR ERDMAN: No, I don't believe it was,...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay, I...

SENATOR ERDMAN: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...to me, that's...why can't we come back next year with it? That's what I guess what I would recommend to the body because I think we should have...might have more implications than just simply a problem in Keith County or in that area so I guess I would just simply...that's normally the rule in this body is we have a public hearing on issues and so, I guess I would be opposed to adopting the Erdman amendment.
