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initially. So that's the answer to that and if you'd like to bring up any of the other specific carved out areas, I'd be willing to tell you the political decision on which it is based. It's a political bill.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you. I was aware of the so-called Boys Town exclusion. I read the hearing record on the bill and that this section was referred to as the Boys Town exclusion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Microphone malfunction) (inaudible).

SENATOR FOLEY: Well, I knew, yeah, I knew this was the Boys Town exclusion, but my question...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what were you asking me? I may have not answered your question.

SENATOR FOLEY: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't...what are you asking me then?

SENATOR FOLEY: No, my question was the definition of a residential care facility. I guess what I'm getting at ultimately is what other institutions, what other entities, might be considered a residential care facility, or is it simply carved out specifically and only to Boys Town?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It was carved out for Boys Town, and any entity which feels that it falls under that definition can place itself under it. If anybody thought that it was there inappropriately a challenge could be made. But it was for Boys Town and I'm sure you understand the living arrangements at Boys Town. And while...

SENATOR FOLEY: To be truth...well, to be truthful, I don't know a great deal about Boys Town.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, well, check it out. Most people here are aware.

SENATOR FOLEY: Yeah.
