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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was that all you had at this point?

SENATOR FOLEY: Well, no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Carry on.

SENATOR FOLEY: Fine. Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I mean in terms of asking me.

SENATOR FOLEY: I have other questions, if you don't mind.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, fire away.

SENATOR FOLEY: If I heard you correctly, there are other entities in the state then that would meet the definition of a residential care facility.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How do I know? What I said is if there is any entity which thinks that that language applies to them and they would like to try to obtain an exemption, they could attempt to do so. If anybody doubted that they validly qualified then they could be challenged.

SENATOR FOLEY: Is it the fact that Boys Town provides overnight care? Is that the determining factor that makes it a residential care facility?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: On that you would have to take it up with Boys Town. They know why they wanted the language. Nobody has had any problem understanding it before. I think you understand it and, if you don't, you could if you tried. A residence is where somebody resides. It's not where they come in today and leave, as in a classroom. You reside there...

SENATOR FOLEY: So it's a...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and I'm sure you understand what that means.
