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FLOOR DEBATE

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That's not the way I operate. So as I stated at the beginning, I'm willing to let the session, as far as these priority bills go, end right here, but the session does not end right here for all purposes, but the session may end right here for other bills also. I stated before that I give it and I can take it, and Senator Landis said he'd like to sit here and watch me take it for awhile, and I want to see if Senator Foley has what it takes to keep us here till midnight. That's what I want to see. But not another bill will be considered because I am not going to invoke cloture; I am not going to have the bill taken off the agenda. So we end consideration of priority bills right here and I don't mind because I will be back next year, the year after, and I may run again, which means I'll have four additional years to continue pushing this issue which I think is just, I believe it is proper. I cannot watch a group discriminated against in such a cruel, hateful manner by people who profess to be religious, because that's what happened to black people. All the religions could show where discrimination and segregation was just. I pointed out how the Catholics...

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** One minute.

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** ...throughout the South kept their schools segregated as a haven for white people fleeing integration in the public schools, so when Catholics stand and do what Senator Foley does it's not really a surprise because his religion is on a sliding scale. But I am not going to let us get off this bill. We will stay on it and I will sit here and listen. I will answer some questions if they make sense, but if they're simple-minded I will just not let myself be reduced to that level. I hope that when I present extended debate it's not as dull, boring and unimaginative as this. You don't hear me reading a lot of things. My student, one who wants to be my student, is a great disappointment to me, but maybe if he practices a little more he'll get better at it. Thank you, Mr. President.
