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to make it consistent otherwise?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, I would prefer not to do that at this point. If this weren't the fifty-eighth day and this wasn't a 500-page bill and we hadn't had the staff working on it, I'd be much more amenable to that. But I'd ask your indulgence and I've give my commitment to introduce a bill next session to actually debate that, that provision, if you would like.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Senator, on page 9, Section 488, starting on line 12, are you there?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, I'm sorry.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The...there is an outline there of the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission, listing a whole number of areas where they are given jurisdiction apparently. Is that a recodification?

SENATOR BROMM: It is an outline of the current areas of jurisdiction, a compilation of those areas. It doesn't add any new areas nor take away any existing responsibilities or jurisdiction.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, it's not intended to add or subtract from what their...what they believe their current jurisdictions to be at this point in time.

SENATOR BROMM: That's correct, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, and it's being done...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...and it's being done for what purpose? For...

SENATOR BROMM: The...one of the main objects of this recodification is to make it much easier to determine what the Public Service Commission rules are and what they have jurisdiction over and, for one who has to deal with them, to
