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because he knows it is flawed, and he knows it is not valid. There are things...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...in the comments of my colleagues which left much unsaid. But I'm very frank, forthright, and direct. And whatever battle I have to wage, I assure you that I will wage it, and I guarantee you that I will be back. But others may not be able to make that guarantee. This is a vote that is appropriate to be made, and it does not prevent these bonds from being purchased. Senator Fellman wanted it in the law, and if Senator Quandahl read the entire history, he knows they were trying to make a statement to buttress Israel at the time when things were not going well for them. And comments were even made about the missiles and bullets that they could shoot today, given to them by America, because they didn't have them two days before. I'm sure Senator Quandahl read that. Now if that is what you all...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...are retaining this in the bill for, so be it. Did you say time, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes, I did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will ask for a call of the house, and I will take a machine vote.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: There's been a request to place the house under call. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The house is under call. Would all members return and record their presence. The house is under call. Senator Engel, Senator Don Pederson, Senator Dwite Pedersen, Senator Beutler, Senator Cunningham, Senator Byars, Senator
