monies that are available, but the total expenditures projected for '03-04 were \$24.5 million, and for the next year another \$20.6 million, and after that \$20.9 million, and after that \$20.6 million. Now some of that is federal money, but a bunch of that is our money. And that's the schedule that was in the project study. I...I don't know if that's accurate, but I'm assuming that that report must mean something. And it looks to me like once this project gets rolling, you spend about \$20 million a year for ten years. That's how you get to \$200 million, and some of that comes from the federal government, but a good chunk of it apparently comes from us. And I just don't think we can make that kind of a commitment, but, Mr. Speaker, I'd withdraw my motion, and we'll see what you all think.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: It is withdrawn. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk, on the motions?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The first motion is to dispense with the at-large reading. Members, would you please take your seats for Final Reading? The first motion is to suspend the at-large reading. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, to dispense with the at-large reading.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The at-large reading is suspended. Mr. Clerk, please read the title.

CLERK: (Read title of LB 1211.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1211, with the emergency clause attached, pass? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal pages 1755-1756.) 33 ayes, 11 nays, 2 present and not voting, 3 excused and not
