CLERK:      38 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoptions of LR 460, LR 461, LR 462, LR 463, LR 466, LR 467, and LR 468.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Those resolutions are adopted. (Visitors introduced.) We next move to legislative confirmation reports. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK:      Mr. President, the first confirmation report, from Natural Resources, found on page 1706.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Chair of the committee, Senator Schrock, you're recognized to open.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, on April 16th at 1:15 in the afternoon, the Natural Resources Committee held a public hearing on the confirmation of Louis Lamberty to the Power Review Board. Mr. Lamberty is a former member of the Environmental Quality Council, the Board of Examiners for highway superintendents, and the Omaha Planning Board. This is a reappointment for him. He has served four years. The Power Review Board has five positions; one has to be an attorney, one has to be an accountant, and one has to be an engineer, and two are lay members. He is filling the engineer position. I think he's a name very familiar to those of you from the Omaha area, as he is from Omaha. Interesting enough, he has a summer home at Johnson Lake, which is in the 38th Legislative District that I represent. So, if you have any questions, I would try to answer that. And the vote was cast unanimously in favor of his reappointment to the Power Review Board.
