5 Introduced by Byars, 30

6 WHEREAS, Bob Hohn was diagnosed in 1999 with Amyotrophic
7 Lateral Sclerosis, also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease (ALS), and
8 died on November 27, 2003; and

9 WHEREAS, Bob was an outstanding football player at
10 Beatrice High School where he earned eleven varsity letters and
11 earned the high school male athlete of the year honors from both
12 the Lincoln Journal Star and the Omaha World-Herald; and

13 WHEREAS, Bob attended the University of Nebraska-Lincoln
14 where he played football and competed in track. Bob was on the
15 Cornhusker football team from 1962 to 1964, lettering two years,
16 and served as a team captain in his senior year; and

17 WHEREAS, in 1964 Bob was drafted by the Los Angeles Rams
18 professional football team, but finally went to the Pittsburgh
19 Steelers where he played for five years as a starting cornerback.
20 Bob played in the 1968 Pro Bowl and also played for the Denver
21 Broncos; and

22 WHEREAS, Bob Hohn was inducted into the Nebraska High
23 School Hall of Fame in 2001, inducted into the Beatrice Educational
24 Foundation Hall of Fame, and, in 2002, was honored at the Beatrice
25 High School homecoming where he was presented with a plaque in
26 recognition of his athletic achievements; and

1 WHEREAS, in the last few years of his life, Bob worked to
2 educate people about ALS, established the Bob Hohn Foundation to
3 raise funds to help other ALS patients.

4 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE
5 NINETY-EIGHTH LEGISLATURE OF NEBRASKA, SECOND SESSION:

6 1. That the Legislature extends its sympathies to Bob
7 Hohn's wife Sandy, his daughter Jenny McMann, and son Jeff Hohn.
