RESOLUTION

LEGISLATIVE RESOLUTION 19CA. Introduced by Schimek, 27; Kruse, 13.

THE MEMBERS OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH LEGISLATURE OF NEBRASKA, FIRST SESSION, RESOLVE THAT:

Section 1. At the general election in November 2004 the following proposed amendment to the Constitution of Nebraska shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval or rejection:

To amend Article VI, section 2:

VI-2 "No person shall be qualified to vote who is non compos mentis, or who has been convicted of treason ~~or felony~~ under the laws of the state or of the United States, unless restored to civil rights.

No person who has been convicted of a felony is qualified to vote until completion of the sentence including parole, if any, for the felony. Upon such completion such person's right to vote is automatically restored."

Sec. 2. The proposed amendment shall be submitted to the electors in the manner prescribed by the Constitution of Nebraska, Article XVI, section 1, with the following ballot language:

"A constitutional amendment to automatically restore a felon's right to vote upon completion of the sentence and parole.
