SENATOR HARTNETT PRESIDING

SENATOR HARTNETT:      Mr. Assistant Clerk, do you have an announcement, or want to read some bill numbers in?

ASSISTANT CLERK:      Mr. President, new bills. (Read LB 69-119 by title for the first time, Legislative Journal pages 34-42.)

CLERK:      Mr. President, new bills. (Read LB 120-121 by title for the first time.) In addition, Mr. President, new resolutions: LR 1CA, offered by Senator Schimek, it proposes a constitutional amendment to the Nebraska Constitution, specifically Article III, Sections 1, 5, 6, 7, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 17, 22, and 27; LR 2CA is by Senator Don Pederson, propose an amendment to Article VIII, Section 2 of the Nebraska Constitution; and LR 3CA by Senator Beutler, again a constitutional amendment proposed to Article III, Sections 7 and 19, and adds a new Section 31 to Article III. Mr. President, I have items for the record. An announcement, a reminder if you will, the Rules Committee will meet tomorrow morning at nine o'clock in Room 1507. Senator Jensen would like to announce that the Health Committee has selected Senator Byars as its Chairperson (sic). And, Mr. President, Committee on Committees would announce that Senator Preister has been selected as that committee's Vice Chairperson. And, Mr. President, finally, this morning I have the preliminary report from the Committee on Committees as signed by Senator Dwite Pedersen, as Chair of that particular committee.
