in February, March, April and May, before we have the benefit of the last Forecast Board in February and certainly before we have the Forecast Board available in April. By making a summary judgment in here, if you will, early in February about what we're going to consider and what we're not, which is possible under the rule of 30, let's call it, those can be rejected out of hand way early in the process, and then we come up into April and find out we have to have everything on the table. Now that's the only thing. And I understand, Senator Chambers, once again, that can cut both ways. If you're inclined to have something off the table early in the game and 20 of you agree, we'll never get the 30 votes to put something on that way. That's the only thing that I can say. And from my...from our committee's standpoint, the discussions we've had, we are so concerned about how we are going to arrive at a consensus on this process, come May 25 let's say. All things have to fall into place, and as a way I see developing a budget, we're going to have to decide in the hearing process what kind of damage is going to be done to Nebraska institutions, and we're going to have to weigh that against any possible increase in revenue. And I don't think that process and I don't think that decision is going to be easy,...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...and I think we need all the time we possibly can have. I think we need all the information we possibly can have. And I think the process that this rule proposes is a, let's call it, simpler way, taking some of the political decisions out of it early in the ball game, if you will. Now I realize some of you will say that's great; I want to stop any run on my particular area that I want way early in the game so that I don't have to worry about protecting my area of the budget. But that's laying it, frankly, on the line. And I know it turns into a political process come May. But I think at this point, making this rule change now and into February, when we're not talking about a specific issue, is a better time to make that decision, rather than trying to find 30 votes...
