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SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. And it's clear in other sections of the statute what the premiums are? Because I don't know what that means, honestly.

SENATOR THOMPSON: If you want to, on Select File, have what a premium is defined, I would be happy to do that.

SENATOR BOURNE: I guess what I'm asking, though, is a premium...I mean, is that fair lingo for something?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yeah, it's fair lingo for prize money.

SENATOR BOURNE: Oh, okay. Fair enough.

SENATOR THOMPSON: At least that's what I learned as a member of the committee. I didn't know that...

SENATOR BOURNE: I understand. Okay, I just...

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...what that meant before.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...I was not aware what "premium" was. I guess, you know, as Senator Thompson presents this amendment, it reminds me of some of the other bills that we've talked about earlier in the year. And we've raised fees for the Game and Parks. And yet we haven't directed the Game and Parks in how they're...limiting them in what they're going to spend it for. You know, maybe we should do that on any additional fees and things. And besides that, this is an optional checkoff. This isn't going to cost anybody any money unless they want it to, whereas some of these fees we've implemented already this year, if you attend a state park, you have no choice. I don't know where Senator Vrtiska is with this amendment. But I can't imagine he's supportive of it. If he would like a few minutes of my time, he's welcome to it.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you. I'm taking some of his time.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Vrtiska.
