they can buy the software from certified software packages that are up to date, or they can hire a certified third party who will establish for them a software program that will keep the Streamlined Project's updated information database on the marketers' computers. In other words, the marketers' computers will be able, at a punch of a button, to be...to satisfy all the states involved because the software package will do the work. The Streamlined Project will essentially certify those packages or those third parties to make sure that, in fact, the database is accurate and up to date, but once they are certified and a marketer is using them, they are then relieved of liability for any mistakes, since, in fact, they're relying on a certified piece of software or a third...certified third party. It's this software, which was updated by these uniform definitions and rules, which will allow a marketer to comply and allow the marketer to essentially, at a cost-effective rate, meet their obligations to forward sales tax back to us. When this happens over time, if we get enough compliance, if we can establish that it's not difficult for a distant company to comply, we set the basis upon which Congress could act and bring in mail-order sales tax base to the state of Nebraska by compelling these kinds of companies to do that. My eventual hope is we will get to a place where the system will be...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...streamlined, effective, efficient, relatively reliable, and thereby Congress will act affirmatively or a state law will be upheld by the Supreme Court because the public benefit will be great and the private cost will be limited. There are a couple of minor committee amendments and I would urge their adoption. I'll explain them in a moment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. You've heard the opening on LB 282. There are committee amendments, as Senator Landis said. And, Senator Landis, as Chairman of the Revenue Committee, you're recognized to open on those committee amendments.
