SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. First item on the agenda.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Vrtiska would move to withdraw LB 170.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I just offered the motion to withdraw LB 170.

SPEAKER BROMM: I'm sorry, Senator Vrtiska. Are you concluded?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, the reason I withdrew it, I've had this bill before, and it hasn't fared very well. And there are a number of bills that are changing the tax on various kinds of liquor. So I decided that there was an overload. I thought it was time to take this bill off. So I ask permission to withdraw it.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Is there any discussion? Seeing none, members, the motion is to allow the withdrawal of LB 170. All in favor please vote aye, and opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to withdraw LB 170.

SPEAKER BROMM: The motion is successful. Next item on the agenda.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 282, on General File, a bill introduced by Senator Landis relating to revenue and taxation. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 13, referred to the Revenue Committee for public hearing. The bill was discussed, Mr. President, on February 6. At that time, Senator Landis opened on the committee amendments, as Chair of the Revenue Committee. I currently have committee amendments pending, Mr. President.
