SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I would renew my request to approve the committee amendments. This is the ratification of the streamlined sales and use tax agreement. And we actually were on the streamlined agreement, for the most part, in our discussion. So I would suggest that we vote on the committee amendments, which I described to you the other day, and were technical in nature. There is a second amendment, based on further review of the movement of language in our statutes, and I'll explain that. And then I'll be happy to continue to work on explaining the bill as a whole. The committee amendments renumber the sections in the definition of lease or rental to be consistent with the agreement, and place a legislative representative appointed by the Executive Board on our state delegation. I would ask for the adoption of the committee amendments, and then we can get on to the bill.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Kruse.

SENATOR KRUSE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. I stand to support the bill. I hope that we aren't worried about cooperation with other states, which I've heard. Obviously, it's to our interest in it. I simply want to remind all of us that merchandising is changing, and I have a good illustration of it. Last week, I was trying to find a consumable part for my printer. Consumable means you're supposed to be able to buy it, and you're supposed to replace that. I went to several dealers. I called all around town to try to find this part from a standard brand printer, and could not find it. They said, finally, we can't buy it either; you'll have to go to the Internet, to the web, and gave me the site of which you should do it. Well, I detest Internet sales. I've learned the hard way to detest them. Several years ago, I gave them up for Lent, and it wasn't hard to do. (Laughter) And I did not want to go back there. But that was the only way that I could get this, is to send \$75 to California, which also bugs me a bit. Now, I've got my part. And Lent is not quite here, so I'm going to give it up for Lent again. Meanwhile, I hope that we recognize that this is the way we're being pushed in merchandising. And we are talking about a lot of money down the road that we need to pay
