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SENATOR WEHRBEIN: (Laugh) No, I get it now.

SENATOR RAIKES: Oh, okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: (Laugh) What you're saying is this is really a revenue loss to the General Fund rather than expenditure out of the General Fund. Would that be accurate?

SENATOR RAIKES: That would be accurate.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Seeing no other senators wishing to speak, Senator Raikes...I'm sorry. Senator Hartnett. Senator Hartnett, did you wish to?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yes, Senator Raikes, could I ask you a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes, would you respond?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Some of the projects have...the school districts made a contract to complete these projects, correct?

SENATOR RAIKES: That's correct.

SENATOR HARTNETT: How far along were they or how many school districts are involved, and how far along are they?

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, in order for this to be of any relevance, the project would have had to be completed by July 31 of 2002.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay, the schools completed the projects. The state said they would reimburse them and then the state changed their mind. Is that...

SENATOR RAIKES: Correct. Correct. That's right.
